Referring to your recent letter published in the Gt. Yarmouth Mercury, I am writing to ask if I could be any help to you.

I have a copy of your book entitled "The Picture House in East Anglia" in which my father Mr Douglas Attree is mentioned. He ran the Coliseum in Gorleston and also managed the Grand Cinema at Lowestoft for a number of years. Also he was a Director of the Regal at Yarmouth and introduced Merle Oberon when it opened with the film "The Six Wives of Henry VIII" [referring to *The Private Life of Henry VIII*] where

my sister presented a bouquet to Merle Oberon.

I don't quite know what information you require. I was born in 1914 and my brother (who is still alive) was born in 1910. My sister is still alive (but doesn't live locally) and she was born in 1915.
