

## A catalogue of publications, 1642-1649, which can be attributed to Andrew and Jane Coe

**Date** – In a few cases, printed material can be dated only from the year given in the colophon. In most, however, there is a more precise date indicated by the information given in the newsbook, dates indicated on the title page, the date on which it was entered into the Stationers' Register or, in the case of those which are part of the British Library's Thomason Collection, the manuscript date added by George Thomason as that on which he collected his copy. Some of the information as to which this is in any particular case, is give in the column marked 'Source'.  
**Pub** – indicates whether a pamphlet was printed and/or published by Andrew or Jane Coe, or, in a few instances, is listed as 'Widow Coe' or as initials, whilst the column 'Co-pub' indicates those on which pamphlets were joint publications and by whom. The authors or editors of any tract appear in square brackets when the information is attributed. The column marked 'No.' indicates, in the main, single issues of a newsbook, or pamphlet, and occasionally, in the case of short runs, newsletters are listed individually. In the case of long runs, or in the case of bundles of the same newsletter registered en masse at the Stationers' Company, the number of editions (invariably weekly) is indicated. When a run of newsletters exists, the date on which the last recorded edition was published is also given. The 'Reg' column gives information as to whether it is known that the publication was registered: 'Y' in the case of those listed in the Stationers' Register or when a title page giving credible notice that it was 'printed according to order' is marked; 'claim' when the title page makes a claim that a piece was published according to order, but there is reason to doubt its veracity; and 'N' when it is clear that there was no formal approval for printing or publication. A 'Y' in the 'Ill' column denotes that the title page contains an illustration: the class mark is given as that in which it is listed in the British Library Thomason Tracts if possible, or, otherwise, the listing in the Wing Short Title Catalogue.
