Voice #2: Antonio Gómez

Cayo Antonio Gómez Ruiz talks in this video about his role as a community leader in Polvorines, where he has worked for over a decade to develop the neighbourhood. He shares how, upon arriving in the 1980s, the area had no infrastructure, and residents had to create their own paths and homes. Cayo Antonio has led efforts to legalise land ownership, collaborating with the Universidad del Valle and the Secretariat of Social Housing. Despite challenges like the pandemic, he remains dedicated to improving living conditions and advancing community development.
