Building skills and knowledge

- **Training.** Policy influencing is something every academic and researcher at every career stage could get involved in. *Introduction to Policy Influencing* training is available throughout the year along with training in areas like writing for policy, engaging with the House of Commons, and how to work with government areas of research interest.
